YEHUDA (JULIUSH) LIPSKI

Juliush Yehuda Lipski, the son of Luzer Lipski, was known in Poland as one of the leaders of the Jewish sports-organizations and of the shooting-club, where he obtained his participation in the Olympic team.

During the war, he went to France and joined the French Résistance, with the rank of commandant. Until the

year 1945, he fought on different war fronts, which brought him an award from General [Dwight D.] Eisenhower. After he received the French War Cross, Yehuda Lipski was awarded the highest award by General [Charles] de Gaulle, the "Medal of the Résistance". The valuable award was given to him during an official military ceremony.

Today, Yehuda Lipski works as a volunteer delegate in the "Bonds for Israel".
