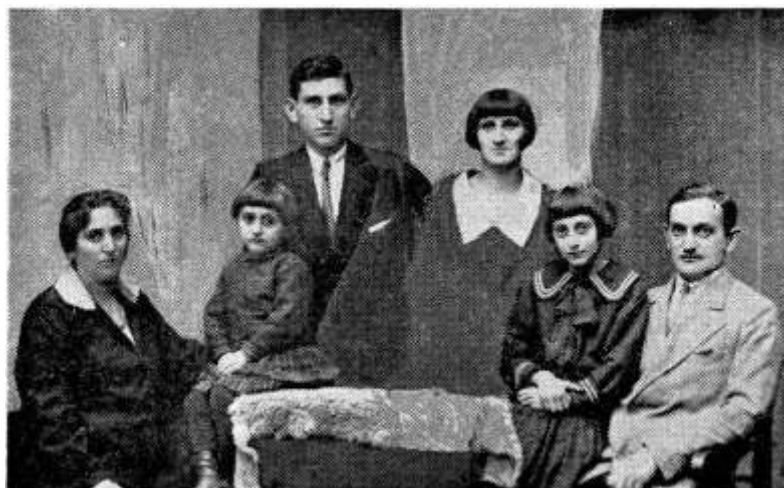

Mrs. **Mindel Kohn** (born **Jadwisz**). was born in Kutno on 8.1.1900, to working parents. She died in Besançon (France) on 8.3.1966. She was a kind-hearted woman. During the German-murderous persecution of Jews in the last war, her sister and two children were taken to the infamous concentration point Drancy, and from there they were taken away to the Auschwitz death camp. The sister and her husband died there. Five children were rescued from



At the tombstone of my unforgettable father R' **Shimon Kohn**, who passed away in 1935: there stand -- my mother **Beila**, the brothers **Feivel**, **Shlomo** and **Yosef**, my brother-in-law **Shaye Rothklajn**, his wife Chana (my sister) and sister **Tabe Rosenfeld** – all killed by the Nazi murderers.

Drancy, among which were the two children of her sister. After she and her girlfriend survived the sad time in hiding, she found the two children with great effort. She took them in, in a very bad sanitary condition and sick. She nursed the children with devotion until she returned them to normal, healthy children. A family took them to America. They are grown men today.

May her father be remembered with praise and honor to her memory.
